Churches are resilient, too. They survive economic and environmental

challenges. They weather storms of controversy, schism and conflict. Churches lose and gain members, change worship, add ministries, and go through pastoral transitions. And somehow churches always seem to endure.

Yes, sometimes churches die when its membership drops so low that it can no longer function. And sometimes churches get torn apart internally over issues of leadership, theology, gossip, worship style, and things like that. But aside from those extremes churches are hard to get rid of. That's because the church is God's idea, not humanity's.


Part of the United Methodist Church's baptism liturgy states that The church is of God and will be preserved to the end of time, for the conduct of worship and the due administration of God's Word and Sacraments, the maintenance of Christian fellowship and discipline, the edification of believers, and the conversion of the world. All, of every age and station, stand in need of the means of grace which it alone supplies.
