



FAREWELL TO THE BEST

As you've probably already heard, I've asked to be reappointed to another church this year. This request is NOT the result of any problems, issues, or conflicts. Rather, due to my father's declining health I need to be closer to my parents. It's a five-and-a-half hour drive from Soddy Daisy to where they live in Virginia. When the time comes for the Lord to call my father home, I'll need to be able to help out my mother. And so, in order to do that I need to be in closer proximity.

If you've been a United Methodist for more than a few years, you know that moving is part of our structure as a denomination. Pastors are appointed to a church for one year at a time. If the pastor or local church discerns it's time for a change, or if the bishop requests that a change be made, clergy in the United Methodist Church relocate to a new appointment. This is called *itinerancy* and it comes from the earliest days of the American colonies, when pastors like Francis Asbury rode circuits on horseback. When clergy are ordained each year at annual conference, we covenant to go where the bishop sends us.

As of this writing I don't know where my projected appointment will be or who will be projected to come to Soddy. We'll learn that on April 4-5 when the Pastor Parish Relations Committee chair and I receive word from

the district superintendent. The PPRC chair, Art McDonald, will be able to announce the name of the projected new pastor on Sunday, April 7 (the Sunday after Easter).

I should also say that a move is not *guaranteed*. From what I hear, there are only 28 vacancies in the entire conference this year (three of those are slated to be here in the Scenic South district). Appointments are made based on the needs of pastors and churches, spiritual giftedness, salary requirements, available openings, and seniority. Since I've asked for a specific geographical region, to be closer to my parents, the reality is that there may not be anything open that fits my salary, giftedness, or the needs of a receiving congregation. If that's the case, Art and I have told the district superintendent that a return to Soddy UMC would be welcomed. At this point—as you read this—I am operating under the belief that I will move in June. We'll know for certain after Easter.

It will *not* be easy to leave you. This church has been such a blessing to Felicia and I for the past 10 years. You took us in after we'd spent five years in a harsh, toxic appointment that had just about taken everything from me. I came here broken, angry, hurt by the church, and deeply wounded by the conference. And you welcomed us in, accepted us, loved on us, gave us time and space to heal, and repeatedly demonstrated your grace, generosity, and devotion.

The church leadership stood with us when our family experienced a difficult season with our son. You showered Felicia with love, support, and hope when her mother passed away. You repeatedly asked me to return as your pastor. This has been my fourth appointment in 24 years of ministry, and it has been, without a doubt, the absolute *best* appointment I've ever experienced. That's not an exaggeration or an attempt at flattery; it's the truth. Only the years I served as a youth pastor come close to the level of satisfaction, joy, peace, and comfort I've enjoyed among you—and this church still outdistances that by a long shot!

I've said before that you probably don't realize what a wonderful gift it is to be part of a healthy church. So many congregations are divided over money, control, facilities, or leadership. So many struggle to pay the monthly bills. So many chew up and spit out pastors like a Major League Baseball player eating sunflower seeds. Too many churches are choked with cliques, with entrenched members who want to hold onto their power, or that are more concerned over saving money for a "rainy day" than with actually helping people in need.

I've seen a lot of this in previous appointments. It ruins churches, jades believers, and destroys the church's witness in the surrounding community. It's toxic and it's unhealthy. And in 10 years as your pastor,

I've never seen any of that from this congregation. Not once. You have so *much* to be proud of as a church, and I thank God for it. Your next pastor will discover what I already know: that this <u>is</u> the best appointment in Holston Conference!

When the time comes to leave, I know I'll do so much healthier, much happier, and in a much better frame of mind than when I arrived. You've been a healing balm for Felicia and I, and I don't think we could ever repay you for your kindness, gentleness, hospitality, and love.

This will be my last newsletter for you. It will be passed off to the Communications Team, who will be responsible for deciding how best to continue communicating with the congregation.

Moving day for transitioning pastors is set for Wednesday, June 26. Your new pastor will arrive that day. My last day as your pastor will be Tuesday, June 25. When I leave I will be carrying a huge piece of Soddy United Methodist Church in my heart forever. I leave you with Paul's prayer from Ephesians 1:15-20, which is also my prayer for you:

¹⁵ Ever since I first heard of your strong faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for God's people everywhere, ¹⁶I have not stopped thanking God for you.
I pray for you constantly, ¹⁷asking God, the glorious Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, to give you spiritual wisdom and insight so that you might grow in your knowledge of God. ¹⁸I pray that your hearts will be flooded with light so that you can understand the confident hope he has given to those he called—his holy people who are his rich and glorious inheritance.
¹⁹I also pray that you will understand the incredible greatness of God's power for us who believe him. This is the same mighty power
²⁰that raised Christ from the dead and seated him in the place of honor at God's right hand in the heavenly realms.
