

Theology, Sexuality and the Future of the United Methodist Church

As you are aware, the United Methodist Church has been struggling with the issue of human sexuality – specifically full inclusion and ordination of LGBTQ persons – for decades. Eighteen months ago, a 35-person taskforce representing global Methodism – known as **The Commission on the Way Forward** – was instructed to meet and discuss the issue, and the impasse that has strangled our denomination for years.

The Commission will present their deliberations of the process, and their recommendations for the future of the church to the Council of Bishops. The Council will, in turn, present those findings to a special *called* session of General Conference next year. (General Conference, held every four years [or *quadrennium* in UMC-speak], is the only body within the United Methodist Church that is authorized to speak on behalf of the whole church).

The called General Conference in 2019 will vote on the proposal from the Council of Bishops/Commission on the Way Forward. And I'm sure the regularly-scheduled General Conference in 2020 will explore ways to move forward in the wake of that decision.

We all know this is a thorny and delicate issue, and sadly no solution will



satisfy everyone. Many of you know LGBTQ persons and so this issue hits close to home. We're aware of other denominations that have moved to fully include LGBTQ persons in leadership and ordination. There are people who have left — and continue to leave — the United Methodist Church as a result of this issue. As I said, it's been an albatross around the neck of our denomination since the 1970s.


But United Methodists have a way to think *theologically* about issues. There is a construct called the *Wesleyan Quadrilateral* that aids us in doing this. The Quadrilateral was not created by Wesley himself, but by theologians who synthesized Wesley's theological perspective.

There are four sides to any quadrilateral, and there are four components that Wesley believed helped Christians to know God better and think theologically about faith and its practice. They are (in order of Wesley's emphasis) *Scripture, tradition, reason and experience.*



To help us better understand the issue of human sexuality in the United Methodist Church, I will be presenting a sermon series in July entitled "It's Hip To Be Square" which will allow us to explore this contentious issue through the four aspects of our Wesleyan theology. While this series will in no way answer every question, it will hopefully give us a stronger theological base from which to consider the future of United Methodism as it relates to the decisions of the called General Conference next year.

I hope we'll gain more insight by considering our church's future from these four angles. I hope you'll bear with me as I present this series since I'm discovering how much I still need to learn about the issue. And I encourage you to continue to be in prayer for our denomination. We are facing a significant point of transition that will shape who we are for a long time to come. May God grant us wisdom, patience, guidance – and as always, "Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors" – no matter what happens.
